*May 31, 2020 – With all the unrest in our nation this past week and past few days, I'd like to pray before we get into the sermon. I want to just settle our hearts and seek the Lord. We need to do that. And the Lord, I feel, just laid a prayer on my heart this morning that I would like to offer up, and do so together with you. So let's do that now. Let's bow our heads and go before the Lord:*
